**A Little Bit About Granny Basketball...**

While the great Iowa tradition of six-on-six basketball ended in Iowa in 1993, the players of granny basketball wanted to bring back the game they originally started to play. Granny basketball has 10 rules that mirror rules women had to follow back in the early 1900s. There are six players on the court, and the court is divided into three sections. Each player has to remain in the court they are assigned. There is no running or jumping and no physical contact and players are prohibited from playing after their third foul. Each player gets two dribbles per possession. Each quarter is eight minutes with a continuous clock and one time out. If a shot is taken underhand, the team is awarded three points; any other shot scores two points, and each foul shot is worth one.
